- Children's attitude towards child sexual abuse and barriers that prevent children and caregivers from reporting abuse






## Methodology











#### Awareness about reporting system in Tribal














### Children's Attitude towards CSA - Perception, Reporting & Barriers









## **Reporting Preferences of Children**

Person whom children chose to reveal the incidents of inappropriate touching at the first instance




## Reason for non reporting of inappropriate touching








### **Barriers for reporting of Child Sexual Abuse**









#### Recommendations

#### **Awareness-Generation**

- There is definite need to create more awareness on the provisions of POCSO ACT among parents, children and community at large.
- 2. Mainstream age-appropriate personal safety education in school curricula, across the country in all streams/boards, which will equip children to recognize abusive situations and report such incidents immediately.
- 3. Strengthen Child Protection Committees at village, block and district levels and enable them to be a first responder in the communities.



#### Recommendations

#### **Strengthening Existing System:**

- Allocate more resources for the Integrated Child Protection Scheme, especially for the purpose of strengthening the reporting and referral services such as CHILDLINE in ruraltribal contexts.
- 2. Systematic and periodical data collection on violence against children, especially child sexual abuse should either be integrated into the existing national surveys or should be conducted as a stand alone survey which would inform formulation of appropriate policies and programs
- Child Protection Policy should be mandatory in all institutions and establishments which are catering to the needs of children and it must include a clear child friendly reporting and referral mechanism.
